




Step 2 : Assembling the mounting rails

Step 1

Before starting lay out all parts to your mount and match them to the parts list provided. Verify that you have all your parts before attempting to assemble the mount.

Step 2

Slide either extension brackets A or B ((18) or (42) depending on which works better for your TV) onto the mounting plate (17) and match up the slots on the extension brackets to the holes on the back of your TV.

Step 3


Determine the correct screw size and if you need to use washers, lock washers, or spacers. *Note: Spacers are used for TVs with recessed hole patterns.* Secure the TV to the extension brackets ((18) or (42)) using the appropriate hardware ((27) through (42)).


Step 4

Center the mounting plate (17) on the TV and use the 5/16" screws (20) and washers (19) to secure the extension brackets ((18) or (42)) in place. Set this aside for now.

Step 5


Mark the ceiling or desired mounting surface in preparation of installation of ceiling plate 1. If mounting to wooden ceiling joists, predrill pilot holes using a 7/32" drill bit. Attach the ceiling plate 1 to the wooden ceiling joist using the 5/16" by 2.5" long lag screw (4) and washer (47) . WARNING: Please verify that your mounting surface will support the combined weight of your mount, mounting hardware, and flat panel. Also verify that the mounting surface is safe to drill through. Please note only mounting hardware for mounting to wooden ceiling joists will be provided with the unit. If mounting to a surface other than wooden ceiling joists then other hardware will be required. If in doubt or uncertain about any of the above, please contact a professional installer.






Step 4 : Securing the mounting rails to the mounting bracket

Step 6

Screw the outer mast (2) into the ceiling plate (1) as tight as possible. Then proceed to take the $\frac{1}{4}$ " – 20 brake screw (11) tighten it down into the pipe couple on the ceiling plate (1) using the M3 Allen key (14). Note: It is important to tighten down the brake screw (11) as far a possible to prevent the outer mast (2) from rotating out of the pipe couple on the ceiling plate

Step 7


If you wish to run cables through the masting of the mount take time to do so now by inserting the head of the cable through the oval slot cut into the ceiling plate (1) running down through the outer mast (2) and then proceeding to run the cable through the inner mast (3). Insert the inner mast (3) into the outer mast (2) and pin the inner mast into place at the desired height us-


ing the M8 hex head screw (12) and nylon nut (13).

Step 8


If you ran cables through the ceiling mast then proceed to feed the head of the cables out through the slot cut into the pipe couple (4) at this time. Remember to leave enough slack at the bottom to allow you to connect to your flat panel. Screw the pipe couple (4) onto the inner mast (3) as tight as possible. Then tighten the $\frac{1}{4}$ " - 20 brake screw (11) into the pipe couple using the M3 Allen Key (14). Note: It is important to tighten down the brake screw (11) as far a possible to prevent the pipe couple (4) from rotating off of the inner mast (3).

Step 9

Attach the swivel bracket (5) to the pipe couple (4) using the large metal washers (6), PVC washers (44) and M16 nylon nut (7). Once the nylon nut (7) is tight, slide the cotter pin (45) through the small hole near the bottom of the screw coming out of the pipe couple (4). Note: Be sure to tighten down the nylon nut (7) as far as possible to prevent sag or list in the mount.

Step 10


Attach the adjusting bracket (25) to the swivel bracket (5) using the M10 screws (24), washers (22) and nylon nuts (21). Insert the adjustable screw (26) into the back of the swivel bracket (5). This screw will control your tilt.

Step 11

Lift the mounting plate (17) with the TV onto the adjusting bracket (25) inserting the metal tabs on the adjusting bracket (25) through the slots on the mounting plate (17). WARNING: This step requires at least two people to prevent possible injury. Use the M5 screws (16), washers (43), and long Allen key (23) to secure the mounting plate (17) to the adjusting plate (25).

Verify all screws and nuts are securely fastened.
